Minute Book & Record of Matches

Note.

A meeting was held at the School on 18th July 1924 to discuss the formation of the Veterans Rifle Club. There were present: Mr. C.H. Hindley (the originator of the Club), Capt. R.F.W. Rokeby (the School coach), and Mr. H. Ford (the School shooting captain).

Mr. C.H. Hindley was elected President and Captain of the Veterans Team for 1924-5, and Mr. H. Ford was elected Secretary-Treasurer for the same period. A list of rules was drawn up and passed, and the meeting then adjourned.

Objects of the Club.

- (a) To provide a strong team for the Veterans Trophy at Bisley, and to bring together old Shooting Colours.
 - (b) If possible, to run local teams, with inter-Locality matches.

Membership shall be limited to old Shooting colours save where the Committee shall decide otherwise. Any O.B. may apply for membership.

There shall be a President and a Secretary-Treasurer, elected annually.

Ш

The Committee shall consist of: The President, the Sec.-Treas., the Capt. of the Veterans Team, the O.C. Blundell's P.T.C., the School shooting coach, and the Captain of the School VIII. The Quorum shall be 3.

IV

- (a) The subscription to the Club shall be 2/6 a year, with an entrance fee of 2/6.
 - (b) Any O.B. subscribing One Guinea shall become a life-member of the Club.

Rules may be altered by a two-thirds majority at a General Meeting of the Club.

The President and the Captain together shall choose the Bisley team, with the advice of the Committee.

VII

Colours. Permission may be granted by the Captain to certain members to wear a "date" on their shooting blazers, similar to the School "dates" but preceded by the letter 'V'.

VIII

A General Meeting of the Club shall be held annually, at Bisley after the Ashburton.

IX

The chair at all meetings of the Club shall be taken by the President, or in his absence by the Secretary-Treasurer. In the absence of both of these, the meeting shall elect a Chairman pro tem.

At the present date (May 1932) there is no trace of this £4. NO subscriptions have been paid since 1926; & there really seems little need for a subscription, as the Club has practically no expenses. The entrance fee for the Competition is normally paid by the School OTC: but it is suggested that when enough OBs turn up to constitute a Second Team, all those present should be invited to subscribe towards the entrance fee for this team.

9th July 1925

A General Meeting was held on the 9th after the Ashburton, at Bisley. The President (Mr. C.H. Hindley), the Sec.-Treas. (Mr. H. Ford), the School Coach (Capt. R.F.W. Rokeby), Mr. J.S. Calvert, and Mr. S.H. Mudge were present.

Mr. C.H. Hindley was again elected President for the season 1925-6. Mr. H. Ford was elected Captain of the Bisley team; and it was decided that the post of Sec.-Treas. should, ex officio, fall on the current School shooting captain, if he were willing to undertake the job.

A discussion arose about the question of a Club competition which had been started this year, but had failed through lack of entries. It was proposed by the President, and seconded by the Secretary, that the competition in its present form should be abolished. This proposal was carried nem. con.

Rules VIII and IX and IV(b) were then added to the Rules, and the meeting adjourned.

8th July 1926.

A General Meeting was held on July 8th after the Ashburton at Bisley. The Sec.-Treas. (Mr. F. Lord), the School coach (Capt. R.F.W. Rokeby), Mr. J.S. Calvert, Capt. R.F.H. Duckworth, Mr. M.E. Gubbins, Lieut. E. Foster Hall, and Mr. H. Ford were present. Mr. H. Ford was again elected Captain of the Bisley team.

It was decided that all "Veterans" should, if possible, send in a few score-cards to the Sec.-Treas. so that the Captain would get some idea as to how people were shooting, and so enable him to get together the best teams possible. It was also decided that a Veterans team should shoot a match against the School on the Wednesday preceding Old Boys Day, if enough people turned up; and also that they should shoot against the School on the day of the Gale & Polden Competition.

The meeting adjourned.

[Note by the School coach:

The Veterans Rifle Club is such a scattered body, and can meet so seldom, that anything in the way of complicated rules or procedure seems foredoomed to failure. Even the fairly simple arrangements made in 1924 collapsed completely within a very short time: and I would suggest that the following system, based on the experience of the last 2 years, should be tried in future.

- 1) That the Club should be run by two O.B. secretaries one being responsible for the Veterans Competition at Bisley, the other (resident in Tiverton) for the match against the School VIII on Old Boys Day.
- 2) That the Hon. Sec. of the OB Club, when sending out the usual circular letter about Old Boys Day, should include questions asking for the names of OBs willing to shoot at Chevithorne in June and at Bisley in July. The lists of names thus obtained would then be sent to the respective shooting secretaries, who would inform applicants whether they were wanted or not.

At a meeting held at Bisley on 7th July 1932, it was decided that (in accordance with the foregoing suggestions). Capt. W.F. Pugsley should act as Tiverton secretary, and Mr. C.H. Hindley (founder of the Veterans R.C.) as Bisley secretary.

A meeting was held on the Century Range at Bisley at 6.15 p.m. on July 13, 1933, at which the secretaries tended their resignations, and, being eligible, offered themselves for re-election. Paymaster-Lieut. Burston moved their re-election, seconded by Lieut. Carey. No one dissenting, the secretaries accepted office. Capt. Pugsley urged the entry of two teams for next year, the entry fee for the second team to be paid for equally by both teams. This suggestion was adopted. The meeting adjourned at 6.25 p.m.

Present - Mr. C.H. Hindley, Capt. W.F. Pugsley, Lieut. R.E. Calvert, Lieut. A. St. G. Carey, Paym-Lt. R.R. Burston, Lieut. R.J.D. Turner, Capt. Abigail (school coach), Mr. Monck-Mason.

July 12th 1934. The Bisley secretary having resigned six days before the Veterans match without having selected a team, the OBs were naturally not at full strength, and the team was made up by the inclusion of H.T. Calvert, who was to leave the School within the next few weeks.

At a subsequent discussion, Capt. C.E. Pridham kindly offered to take on the work of Secretary.

Present: Capt. C.E. Pridham, Pay-Lieut. R.R. Burston, C.G.M. Alvington, R.R.C. Halahan, Major R.A. Abigail.

<u>July 11th 1935.</u> It was not possible to hold a full meeting of the Teams as shooting did not finish until nearly 8 pm and some members had to leave early. For the first time in the history of the club it was possible to enter 2 full teams. Mr. C.E. Pridham suggested that some other O.B. with more leisure would make a more efficient Secretary, which who would help in be able to devote more time to the selection of the best possible team. There were no suggestions forthcoming for other members, so Mr. Pridham offered to carry on for another year.

Present:- Mr. C.E. Pridham, Mr. A.B. Edwards, Mr. J.A. Mudge, Mr. H.T. Calvert, Mr. R.G. Sanders, Mr. G.B. Drewitt, Major Abigail.

1936-9 No Notes appear to exist of meetings of The Veterans Rifle Club on these occasions.

The officers were:

Captain: Paymaster Commander R. St. E. Burston, Royal Navy.

Secretary: Major C.E. Pridham.

<u>1940-46</u> There were no competitions and the Club was dormant during this period.

Major Abigail sent a card to former members and former members of the school teams inviting them to come to Bisley and two teams were formed from those who came. At a meeting on the firing point, the following officers were appointed. Captain: Maj. A.B. Edwards. Secretary: Mr. W.H. Smith.

Earlier most of the members had witnessed the closing stages of Blundell's victory in the Ashburton Shield, and afterwards they were invited by Major Abigail to join the team in a magnificent banquet in honour of the occasion.

3rd July 1947 A very good attendance of Veterans this year made it possible to enter three teams in the Competition. As the exact attendance of members was unpredictable up till the last moment, "shadow" teams were formed on paper and adjusted at the last moment. The Captain was unable to come this year and, in his absence, the teams were organised by the Secretary with the invaluable assistance of Major Abigail.

No formal meeting of the club was held this year. <u>Present</u> on the firing point, were the members forming the teams, Major R.A. Abigail, W.P. Brooke-Smith (School Coach).

8th July 1948. A meeting was held on the firing-point immediately after the Veterans Match (present: members of the 3 teams, plus the Rev GB Smith, Major R.A. Abigail, & Mr Brooke-Smith) to consider a suggestion by the School Coach that the Veterans RC be re-vitalised. This was especially important now that the Veterans' score was combined with the School's score for the Lucas Cup.

Major Abigail suggested that W.H. Smith be appointed Bisley Captain, and that he himself should act as secret organising secretary during the year. He proposed this with some diffidence, and did so only because he had some personal knowledge of all the shooters who had left Blundell's in the last 22 years. Both proposals were adopted unanimously, and the meeting adjourned.

At a meeting held on the firing-point before the Veterans match, approval was unanimously given to the Secretary's request that the subscription be raised (as from the end of the current year) from 5/- for 3 years to 2/6 a year.

At a meeting on the firing point after the Veterans match, Mr. W.P. Brooke-Smith was elected "Secretary-Treasurer" in place of Major Abigail, who had expressed a wish to retire; Major Abigail who was elected president, subject to his acceptance, and the Bisley Captain (W.H. Smith) was re-elected. All these elections were unanimous. Present: members of the two teams and Mr Brooke Smith, less G.C.I. Lilly and G.B.G. Smith who had to leave early.

10th July 1954

At a meeting of the Magpies after dinner in the HAC Hut the Secretary-Treasurer and the Bisley Shooting Captain were re-elected. It was suggested that S.A. Batten be asked to be permanent Chevithorne Captain. Consternation was expressed about the lack of permanent record of past Shooting VIIIs: since the Boards were removed from the former Gym the Rugger, Cricket, etc., teams have been commemorated in a vellum book, but the Shooting teams have been omitted. The Sec.-Treasurer promised to do his best about this important matter.

The Sec.-Treasurer was asked to keep a watching brief on the question of a combined set(?) to cover all OB sports. Feeling appeared to be only luke-warm in favour of such an idea.

12th July 1956 (From WH Smith's letter dated 14th July 1956)

The Veterans meeting this year was diverted(?) from the Schools' Meeting. One team was entered, but as more turned up WH Smith made a last minute entry of a 2nd team, the Veterans sharing the expense, and AS Gray & H Bridge hiring a rifle between them (These expenses have been credited against their subscriptions).

Suggestions of the meeting were:

- A. Nominate a Saturday in June for a practice and let those wishing to come let WH Smith know in advance. Members could be given a practice on one of the Club's targets, or one could be hired for the day (about £5)
- B. If the Veterans and Ashburton are going to be separated again it was suggested that those who can should get to Bisley at lunch-time and have a shoot in the many free targets available. Also one of two rifles might be hired.
- C. It was suggested that the teams be entered as Blundell's Magpies and not as Blundell's School.
